WHAT A YEAR OF SERVICE LOOKS LIKE

Operation HELP recently compiled service statistics for the previous year. Although the true impact of our work is in the lives of people who have been helped, the numbers also tell a story about the scope and scale of programs.

Last year...

- More than 2,100 people in 849 households were reached by Operation HELP services.
- 437 households throughout St. Croix County received rent, utility or car repair assistance totaling \$236,156.
- The Resource Center received 1,693 visits from families and individuals seeking food and clothing vouchers; toiletry and hygiene items; socks or underwear; diapers; pet food; and laundry or gas vouchers.
- 508 kids from nearly 200 families received Christmas gifts from 175 sponsors.
- 46 percent of households had children under the age of 18; 26 percent had children age 5 or younger.
- 72 percent of clients served were female; 22 percent of clients identified as persons of color.
- Approximately 50 percent of clients reported household income at or below federal poverty guidelines.
